

- ✓ Spare tire



# Winter driving tips







Allow for extra travel time.



Clear snow and ice off of your windows, mirrors and lights.



Use your lights properly.



Slow down and increase your following distance.



In snowy conditions, drive in the tracks of the car ahead of you.



Avoid using cruise control in inclement weather.



Keep an eye out for downed trees and power lines in the road.



Don't drive through flooded areas.



Know when to brake and when to steer.



Brake early and slowly instead of slamming on the brakes.



If you start to skid, don't panic.



Use caution when driving over bridges or overpasses.




Drive distraction free.

Remember this trick if you're stuck in snow.




Stay in your vehicle if you become stranded or stalled on a roadway.


